

## **Student Academic Offenses**

If you have been accused of an academic offense you can take the following steps:

## When your instructor suspects you committed an academic offense

- □ The instructor will request a meeting with you and the Department Chair, within 10 days of receiving the evidence.
- $\Box$  You must respond to the meeting request within 7 days and schedule the meeting.
- $\Box$  You can review the evidence in this meeting and present your perspective.
- □ The instructor will determine if an offense has been committed and inform you of this, and the penalty, within 7 days of the meeting.

## If you wish to appeal, contact the Academic Ombud: <a href="mailto:ombud@uky.edu">ombud@uky.edu</a> 257-3737

- □ To appeal the decision and/or penalty, you must contact the Academic Ombud within 10 days of the notification from the instructor.
- □ Collect all documentation that might support your perspective (e.g., course syllabus, emails, canvas messages, grades, etc.).
- $\Box$  Request a meeting with the Academic Ombud to share your perspective.
- □ Grant the Academic Ombud permission to try to resolve the issue, if appropriate.

## If you should submit an appeal

- $\Box$  Submit your letter of appeal, according to the instructions provided.
- □ Provide all supporting documents.
- □ The Academic Ombud will file your appeal within 30 business days of receiving all information.
- □ The University Appeals Board Chair will schedule a hearing within 20 business days and invite you to attend.
- □ If your appeal of the penalty does not have merit, you have 30 days to appeal that decision.
- □ The decision of the University Appeals Board is final. You will be notified via email and mail.
